Explore the shipyard, walk the decks, travel to the depths of the ocean and uncover the true legend of Titanic in the city where it all began...



GALLERY 1: BOOMTOWN BELFAST

Start the Titanic story in *Boomtown Belfast*, walk through the famous Harland & Wolff shipyard gates and discover why 100 years ago, Belfast was a thriving city and the perfect location to build the biggest ship in the world. Try your hand at communicating with the Marconi device, like the one used on RMS Titanic and witness the conversation between James the butler and his colleague.



GALLERY 2: THE SHIPYARD

The whistle has blown and it is time to get to work. Rise to the top of the Arrol Gantry and immerse yourself in the construction of Titanic. Explore the blueprints of Titanic and feel the heat of the steel and hear the riveters at work on the Shipyard ride.



GALLERY 3: THE LAUNCH

Transport yourself to 12.13pm on 31st May 1911 to the site where Titanic was built as you soak up the atmosphere of launch day. Hear the intake of breath as Titanic launches into the water for the first time and imagine the historic slipway packed with over 100,000 spectators who witnessed the spectacle.



GALLERY 4: THE FIT-OUT

From the luxury of first class to the heat of the engine room, experience life on board Titanic with an authentic taste of the unique engineering and superb craftsmanship that made Titanic so special. Get to know the passenger quarters, with recreations of the first, second and third-class cabins, discover the fabrics and crockery used on-board and listen to the music of Wallace Hartley's band as the passengers would have enjoyed it.




**GALLERY 8:
